Data Protection

With the introduction of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) in May 2018, Maple Lodge Conservation Society has had to implement new rules for the management of members' data. GDPR requires us to have your explicit permission to use your data for the stated purposes listed below.

It is therefore very important that you complete and sign this form.

The data collected by the Society comprises:

The data is used to communicate with members of the Society for the following purposes:

- Notices of AGM and any other meetings
- Subscription renewal information
- Information from and about similar organisations in our area

The data is not shared with any other organisations except for HM Revenue & Customs in the claiming of Gift Aid.

Members' data is stored on a home computer and is password protected. A copy of the data (also password protected) is stored in a secure off-site location. The data is available to the Chairman, the Treasurer and one other committee member.

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RULES OF THE SOCIETY

These rules are designed to ensure the safety and security of members, visitors, and the wildlife on the reserve.

It is a condition of membership that all members sign to agree that they have read the rules and will abide by them.

Members are reminded that they too are responsible for their own health and safety when on the reserve, together with that of their visitors. There are some potentially hazardous areas on the reserve and so members and visitors **must** keep to the permitted paths (see Rule 1).

As the reserve is unmanned, it is recommended that members visiting on their own should carry a mobile phone if possible.

Rules applying to all:

- 1. Members and visitors must keep to the permitted paths. Wheelchair access is limited to designated paths.
- 2. All members must have received a tour from a committee approved representative prior to joining the Society.
- 3. Members and all visitors must sign in on arriving and out on leaving the reserve.
- 4. An adult member may bring up to two visitors on to the reserve. All visitors must read the Society's rules and sign the admissions book to this effect.
- 5. Members wishing to bring groups on to the reserve must gain prior agreement to do so from the committee.
- 6. Anyone under the age of eighteen must be accompanied by an adult, unless they hold a Young Naturalist membership.
- 7. Cars to be left in the car park or Chiltern Club car park, space permitting. Cars, equipment etc. are left at owners' own risk on the reserve, in the clubhouse, in the car park or in the Chiltern Club car park.
- 8. No dogs are permitted on the reserve, with the exception of registered assistance dogs.
- 9. There shall be no cycling, camping, fishing, shooting, boating, bathing, ferreting, drone flying or activities likely to cause a disturbance on the reserve.
- 10. The water level and conservation work shall be controlled by the committee.
- 11. Fire lighting is not permitted. The only exception to this rule is when such a requirement has been agreed by the committee.
- 12. The planting and picking of plants, flowers, fruit, or fungi are forbidden, unless agreed by the committee.
- 13. No plants, animals, or any other wildlife shall be introduced on to the reserve without the prior agreement of the committee.
- 14. Photography is allowed from the permitted paths and hides. Permission must be sought from the committee for photography in other areas. (Please note that it is an offence to disturb nesting birds).
- 15. Attracting birds by playing recordings of calls and songs is not permitted without the prior agreement of the committee.
- 16. The policy of the Society is that information regarding the presence of a rare species on the reserve will not be passed to any outside information service.

Rules applying specifically to beekeepers.

- 1. Beekeepers can operate singly providing that they have an Epi-pen and mobile phone with them.
- 2. Beekeepers without an Epi-pen must work with a second person available and a mobile phone.
- 3. Full beekeeper protection suit including veil and gloves must be worn at all times when accessing the hives.
